Welcome to the newly refurbished Village Hall

After many months of planning, the village hall roof has been replaced, along with improved insulation, and the opportunity has been taken to

install solar panels. The toilets have also heen refurbished

Q: Why replace the entire roof? A: The roof was over 40 years old with increasing leaks due to deterioration of the felting and tiles.

Q: What about roof insulation?

A: Extra insulation has been added

during re-roofing to reduce heating costs and improve hall comfort, Reducing energy consumption is vital for our sustainable future.

Q: Why fit solar panels and batteries?

A: The Village Hall's electricity costs will significantly increase next year because a low-cost fixed price contract will soon end. Solar panels will generate electricity for the Hall, and the battery system will enable electricity generated during the day to be used at night.

Q: What will happen when the sun doesn't shine?

A: Electricity may need to be bought from the grid in winter, but surplus electricity from the panels will be exported and sold back to the arid when the sun shines.

Q: Why isn't the whole roof covered in solar panels?

A: Enough solar panels have been fitted for the village hall's everyday needs. Covering the roof would contribute to national energy generation but cost more, so the money saved has been used to refurbish the toilets instead. More panels can be added in the future if they generate enough energy to repay the cost of their installation.

Q: Why refurbish the toilets?

A: Resident feedback at the Happening in the Hall and other events confirmed that refurbishing the toilets to fresh, modern standards is a priority for hall users.

Q: When will the work be finished?

A: Roofing, solar energy system and toilet refurbishment will be completed by 1 September unless exceptional bad weather delays them. The Hall will reopen in time for the new school year.

Q: How much will it cost and how is it being paid for?

A: After securing competitive quotes and drawing up detailed specifications to ensure value for money, the total cost for re-roofing, insulation, solar energy systems, and toilet refurbishment will be approximately £100,000. Thanks to the Community Association's prudent saving in past years and a £10K grant from CWaC, there is enough money without borrowing.

Guilden Sutton 10K and Fun Run Sunday morning, 15 September

Hope to see you in September, running in either of the races or cheering on the runners.

The 10K starts at 11.00 in Belle Vue Lane opposite Middlecroft, does a loop of Guilden Sutton Lane/Hare Lane/Belle Vue Lane, comes back past the start point and then heads out again down Guilden Sutton Lane/Hare Lane down to the Vets on the A51. From there, the race goes down the wide pavement to Wicker Lane, returning to the village to finish at the Village Hall. Chip timing will give you your result within minutes of the race's finish via email or text to your mobile phone.

At 12:15, the Fun Run will start on Hilltop Road. This goes out via Arrowcroft Road, turning left on the pavement along School Lane up to Oaklands. Running all the way around Oaklands, back out to School Lane and then round once more before turning into Hilltop Road to the finish at the Village Hall. <u>Entries to the Fun Run are on the day ONLY at</u> <u>the Village Hall</u> from about 09:00, and there will be an award for all finishers. Refreshments will be available in the Village Hall, provided as usual by the local Cubs group.

Temporary road closures will be implemented for the Start in Belle Vue Lane (from approximately 10:50 until 11:05) and Wicker Lane (from about 11:15 until about 11:50).
